G'day', sailors! In lieu of the mysteries of record-keeping, I researched recent boating safety and Homeland Security issues in the Mid-Atlantic, and found...nothing.

So, I figured, the next best topic is vessel preparation, including getting ready for your Vessel Safety Check.

<u>S/V Certainty</u>: Our baby is under tarps in the yard at Maryland Marina for the winter. Last weekend I had to remove a bunch of things from the cabin - the steps, the couch, and the center cabin deck panel, to open up the bilge and remove the gasketed lid to the keel well, so I could replace the pendant rope and take a look at the hinge pin for the keel, which can swing up into this position. All was well, and I got the lid back on, but have to carefully torque it down so the baby doesn't sink in her slip (again – didn't happen under my watch, but I don't want it to happen since I had to replace the electronics).



Ooof, 56 bolts to torque down in a complex pattern.

I've got half of the teak refinished and reinstalled, and some more is in the workshop; and I am going to put a new laminate on the cabin sole before I put the rest of the furniture back. Then scrape and paint the antifouling on the lower hull but that doesn't take too long on a 22' boat. Oh well, that's what weekends are for!




