First Aid on the Boat and at the Dock Do you know what to do?




Speaker: Dr. Barry Cohan

Dr. Cohan will demonstrate the proper use of an AED, discuss emergency situations that may arise on and around the boat, as well as the First Responder's program. Dr. Cohan is a practicing dentist (since 1974), has been the Fleet Surgeon at Baltimore Yacht Club for the past 4 years where he implemented their First Responder's program, and is a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary where he is a Vessel Safety Examiner and has earned the rank of Coxswain. The Coxswain has the authority to direct all boat and crew activities during the mission and modify planned missions to provide for the safety of the boat and the crew. In addition, Dr. Cohan has the prestigious **AUXOP** member designation for having completed the following six advanced specialty courses: Seamanship, Navigation, Communications, Search & Rescue, Patrols, and Weather.

A Monumental Flag-Raising for D-5

A formal flag-raising ceremony is part of every District 5 Summer Council, but there's never been one like Dundalk put on as part of its duties as host squadron this year. D/Lt Bernie Karpers, S persuaded Fort McHenry to allow the District to raise the huge 17' x 25' storm flag over the historic fort. D/Lt Karpers, who is also a Dundalk Past Commander and physician to Fort McHenry, welcomed scores of District 5 officers, members and guests to the ceremonies. Current Dundalk Commander, Tracey Stuenes also greeted the many Power Squadron visitors.

P/D/C Bill Seldon emceed the honor guard which saluted all the attending District 5 Bridge officers, Squadron Commanders and other dignitaries. Another Dundalk Past Commander, Sandra Davis, was a member of that honor guard.

Ranger Scott Sheads, historian for Ft. McHenry, offered a brief history of the fort and its flags. He reminded the crowd that 194 years ago Fort McHenry gained a prominent part in the nation's history during the War of 1812. On Sept. 12, 1814 50 British war ships mounted a 48 hour bombardment of the fort from 6 miles away.

Francis Scott Key, aboard an American flag of truce vessel observed the raising of the American flag over the fort after the conclusion of the bombardment. This moved him to write our National Anthem, *The Star Spangled Banner*. That made it all the more moving when District 5 member Sharon Richards sang the anthem after the flag was raised.

Ranger Sheads also stated that there are more sites on the Chesapeake Bay relating to the War of 1812 than any other place in the U.S.

Following Ranger Sheads remarks, the District 5 attendees unfolded the massive storm flag which was then attached to the pole and raised. The flag is an exact replica of the flag which flew over the fort during the bombardment.

CONGRESS RESTORES 35-YEAR EXEMPTION FOR RECREATIONAL BOATS FROM PROPOSED EPA PERMITTING REQUIREMENTS

NO NEW PERMIT FOR BOATS REQUIRED

ALEXANDRIA, VA, July 22, 2008 - In a remarkable display of bipartisan support for recreational boating, both the House and Senate today passed S. 2766, "The Clean Boating Act of 2008" which will permanently restore a long-standing exemption for recreational boats from permitting requirements under the Clean Water Act. The legislation now goes to the White House for the President's signature.

Congressional action was spawned by a U.S. District Court decision in September 2006 under which an estimated 17 million recreational boats would have fallen under Clean Water Act permit requirements effective September 30, 2008. The permit would have dictated maintenance and operation procedures and potentially subjected boaters to citizen lawsuits as well as a penalty system designed for industrial polluters.

"This is a fabulous victory for common sense and it just goes to show what can be done when the boating public, the marine industry and its representatives in Congress row together in a bipartisan way," said BoatU.S. President Nancy Michelman.

BoatU.S. Government Affairs Director Margaret Podlich was quick to shower praise on a boatload of legislators who did much of the heavy lifting including Sens. Bill Nelson (D-FL) and Barbara Boxer (D-CA) and Representatives Jim Oberstar (D-MN), Steve LaTourette (R-OH), Candice Miller (R-MI) and Gene Taylor (D-MS). BoatU.S. has worked for more than a year with the National Marine Manufacturers Association and a broad coalition of stakeholders to resolve the problem before the permitting deadline.

"One of the real keys to success here was our collective ability to activate the grassroots," said Podlich, noting that tens of thousands of letters and e-mails were generated by boaters and anglers over the course of the past 12 months.

BoatU.S. is the nation's leading advocate for recreational boat owners with over 650,000 members.




