Boating season is here at last! I stated in my column last month that my greatest wish is for the safety of all members as we begin this summer's schedule of boating events. Susan and I just completed our maiden voyage for this season by bringing S/V Tiphys from her winter home to our summer berth on Rock Creek. We began on a very still morning with nary a whisper of breeze. Upon reflection this was a blessing in disguise as we were able to depart our dock without great forces acting upon us in a narrow fairway. As we entered the Bay and worked our way north we were able to take advantage of light breezes to test our sails for the first time of the season. Being assured that all was shipshape with the sails we resorted to motoring for a couple of hours until the winds built to sufficient force to allow us to sail at a reasonable speed. As we approached Baltimore Light Susan began to wonder what became of the small craft warnings that had been issued for the day. We soon found out that they were not issued in error. We saw in the distance the unmistakable darkening of the water that signifies much stronger winds. In short time we went from the light breezes to somewhere around 20 knots with gusts upwards of 30. The last 90 minutes of our trip were spent motoring (only because we had a tight schedule to keep) into the 2 to 3 foot waves of a serious headwind. Docking at our berth was somewhat more exciting than when we left some 8 hours earlier.

The point of the story, getting back to my topic of safety, is that from start to finish we were wearing our personal flotation devices (PFD). This is a practice we started when we first purchased our boat and continue today. We put them on when we start readying the boat for departure and don't remove them until we are safely moored at our

destination or on anchor. I liken this practice to using seat belts when driving a car. Most people automatically buckle up without conscious though; it's an ingrained part of getting in the car for trips small and large. The same could and should be true for all boaters whether going for a short ride on the water or a much longer cruise. As teachers and practitioners of safe boating I believe that we, as a Squadron, should set the example and endeavor to wear our PFDs at all Squadron events and whenever flying our burgee. This sends a message to the public that we are serious about what we teach. Safety first!

Last month I talked about the new summer seminar series with Cruise and Cruise planning. It's not too late to join and the next session will be at the Wurst Cookout at Red Eye Yacht Club on June 10<sup>th</sup>. Please note that at least one version of the flyer for that event went out with the wrong date. The event is the weekend of June 9-11<sup>th</sup> with the class and the cookout being on Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup>.

One of the new and exciting opportunities in the education department is to have an on the water or OTW segment of each class. This month Dundalk kicked off its first ever OTW class. This is an additional class which enables the student to utilize the information being taught in the classroom in a real life situation. The United States Power Squadron has secured insurance for this type of class provided we follow their guidelines. One of these is a requirement that the course be presented to the executive committee in advance. Another is that the vessel have a current Vessel Safety Check.

The piloting class, led by instructor Steve Dalgarno, were able to put their piloting skills to the test. The class included plotting the vessel's course in advance and then calculating DR positions as we ran. Steve also demonstrated the use of software on an ipad for the same navigation purpose and to evaluate the accuracy of the DR's

Many thanks to P/C Douglas Riley, AP for volunteering Lorenzo for this class. While not a "three hour tour" it did have potential to be interesting. We departed around 1915 and enjoyed a wonderful sunset to the west as we monitored thunderstorms and lightning to the south. Returning to the dock in the dark was also a great learning experience. We are looking forward to doing more OTW training on other courses in the near future.

### Their Fishing Report at

http://dnr2.maryland.gov/Fisheries/Pages/fishingrepo rt/ index.aspx gives helpful tips as far as what fish are out there, and how much other stuff you might have to contend with – for example, the 5/10/report says among other things,

"The flood gates at the Conowingo Dam are open and cold and stained water is pouring through into the lower Susquehanna River. This past weekend's extreme high tides also added floating wood debris to the mess. The striped bass catch and release season is closed in the area so the most common fish being targeted now are white perch and catfish. The American shad and hickory shad are still in the river and providing some catch and release fun. There are a lot of white perch in the river at this time and should be for another week or so, making for a great time to catch some filleting size perch."

Lots of other useful stuff for the rest of the Bay, too!

I checked in with DHS, and there's not much happening there boat-wise right now. I can't imagine what else in Washington they have on their minds at the moment. What's more important than boats??

That's it for this month, I gotta go get to work on the boat. Cheers!
