TRUFFLE, The Boating Safety Dog!!!!

Greetings, boaters! No breaking news in the world of note-taking, thankfully, so here's a check of the newswires:

A new mobile app feature is available from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources to alert boaters of speed limits and zones on state waterways. The new service on the department's free AccessDNR app covers the Chesapeake Bay, coastal bays west of Ocean City, Potomac River and Deep Creek Lake. You can search for speed zones by river system and zoom in to highlight an area of interest. A click on a shaded area of the map accesses the appropriate state regulation and shows the type of speed restriction governing that area. Boaters can print a map or link the app to the GPS on their vessel to track their route and signal when they are approaching a speed zone.


- · Excessive speed and boat wakes were responsible for 56 accidents in 2016. Last year, the Maryland Natural Resources Police issued 489 speeding tickets and written warnings. Tickets typically carry a fine of \$85. (We aspire to the day when we can get a speeding ticket in old S/V Certainty!)
- The AccessDNR app can be downloaded from the iPhone App Store or Google Play. It is the official app from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources.

THE ELECTRONIC AGE

With all our modern marine technology, from GPS navigation to IPS joy-stick control, it was only a matter of time before the Squadron's information system would also go "electronic."

In the face of rising costs to print and mail *On the Horizon* to 130 households every month, the Squadron's Executive Committee voted at its October meeting to discontinue a paper newsletter and, instead, to publish only an electronic version of *On the Horizon*. Starting in January 2018, the Squadron's newsletter – in full color – will be delivered to your email address as set forth in the Squadron Roster or as updated in the Email Correction and Opt-Out Form, included in this edition of *On the Horizon*.

We recognize that a few Squadron members do not have email addresses or easy access to a computer. If receiving an electronic version of *On the Horizon* is impossible for you, or a hardship, or even merely difficult, please complete the form below, and return it to me. As it is important that no one be left in the dark, several members of the Bridge and Executive Committee have volunteered to "adopt" others without easy email access, and to print and mail from their computers a hard copy of *On the Horizon* every month.

Please also complete the Email Correction and Opt-Out Form if (1) your email address has changed or (2) your email address is not listed at all in the Squadron's 2016-2018 Roster.

Finally, we shall also be voting at our December meeting on a by-law revision, consistent with the model By-laws of the United States Power Squadrons, that allows official Squadron notices, such as those required for our annual meeting and elections, to be delivered by email.
