As mentioned before, we addressed this mission, felt good about ourselves and improved relations with the Bowley's Quarters VFD when we presented them with a check for \$500 to put towards the rescue boat vandalized in the spring. This was not arrived at lightly, but deliberated in an Executive meeting to be sure that we stuck to our mission. I believe we have.

That brings us to our recent 4-week long Restaurant Raffle and what happened. The prizes were a \$300 certificate to Cinghiale Restaurant which we purchased. On the last day, Cinghiale DONATED a second diner for 4. With little prompting, Anchorage Marina offered a free night stay. Finally, West Marine stores in Rosedale and Baltimore donated a heavy duty boat hook, automatic inflatable life vest, Igloo backpack cooler and a shiny chromed ships bell. Curiously, the first prize was won by one of my neighbors. All of the other prizes were won by members who were present at the meeting. What are the odds?

Greetings, boaters! No breaking news in the world of note-taking, thankfully, so here's a check of the newswires:

Florence has come and gone, but it's still hurricane season for another couple of months. Plus, not sure if you noticed, but it's been raining like crazy this year. The Department of Natural Resources' (DNR) recent newsletter cited the local Notice to Mariners from the Coast Guard that warned of damaged, shifted, and missing navigational aids due to storms, and while I didn't see any around here, this sort of thing can happen at any time. You can tell DNR about any you see with problems at http://dnr.maryland.gov/boating/Pages/hydro_ops.aspx.

Other hazards to navigation you might run into (literally!) after a storm - besides all of those darn trees! – are sunken boats. Abandonded boats can also be reported to DNR, and they have a slow-but-steady program to pull them out. See the Abandoned Boat and Debris Program at http://dnr.maryland.gov/Boating/Pages/abandonedboats.aspx

The Natural Resources Police (NRP) had a busy Labor Day Weekend. They report that officers were in contact with 8,354 citizens and visitors where they conducted 1,446 boat safety inspections and arrested four people on charges of boating while intoxicated. There were five boating accidents, none of which resulted in serious injuries or property damage; that number is down slightly from last year, when seven accidents were reported. Officers issued 386 citations for violations and 625 written warnings, none to me, fortunately.

Captain Jeannie and I made it over to the celestial navigation demo in Rock Hall on 9/9/18, it was terrific despite the deluge. We chickened out and drove around, it would have been a nasty haul getting over there in our little boat, and getting home would have been worse. Many thanks to Captain Terry Slattery, SN, of the Annapolis Squadron, who (with his charming boatmates) hosted us aboard their lovely Leopard 40 catamaran, *Lux*, which you may have seen at the Squadron Crab Feast – it was a lot more comfortable than outside would have been, even in our foulies. Can't beat a personal introduction to sextants from 5 or 6 SNs! Thanks also to Lt. Susan Rudy, SN, and P/C David Blades, SN, for setting it up and doing most of the teaching. Plus, the after-class hors d'oeuvres and beverages aboard the *Lux* were also wonderful! You can read an article about Cap'n Terry and his gang of cut-throats, and how they came to acquire the *Lux*, in the September edition of *Spinsheet*, available everywhere there's water nearby (p. 56-8).

Be safe out there, and watch out for the folks that DON'T take our classes.


