



affair. Sept. 30- Oct 2 will be the District Fall Festival and Sail Regatta at Herrington Harbor





As you visit the various places in Gettysburg please present your squadron meeting badge. Merchants participating in this program will offer a discount or present you with special offers.




This is a time you will be able to see some of the sights, such as the Jenny Wade House, the Hauser Estate Winery or visit the retail outlet centers.


