

Galloway Yacht Club's opening is May 7<sup>th</sup> at


Middle River; May 8th at Crescent Yacht Club; and May 29th

### Flag Etiquette

In 1998, USPS in consultation with the U.S. Coast Guard, Coast Guard Auxiliary, New York Yacht Club and other yachting authorities developed an updated nautical flag code, *How to Fly Flags, Nautical flag Display* for use on private vessels. The new nautical flag code is flexible enough to accommodate the wide variation in construction of modern pleasure craft. New configurations of boats, riggings and the like have slightly modified the traditional points of honor. Use of antennas, fishing towers, outriggers, sailboat backstays, portside halyards, and double hoisting are all new to the nautical flag code. The booklet is available from USPS Headquarters and various marine retailers around the country for around seven dollars.



#### What is a Vessel Safety Check (VSC)

A Vessel Safety Check is a courtesy examination of your boat (Vessel) to verify the presence and condition of certain Safety Equipment required by State and the Federal regulations. The Vessel Examiner is a trained specialist and is a member of the United States Power Squadrons or the US Coast Guard Auxiliary. They will also make certain recommendations and discuss certain safety issues that will make you a safer boater.

This is not boarding or a law enforcement issue. No citations will be given as a result of this encounter. We will supply you with a copy of our evaluation so that you may follow some of the suggestions given. Vessels that pass will be able to display our distinctive VSC decal. This does not exempt you from law enforcement boarding, but you can be prepared to make this a positive encounter. (Spring is Coming!)


**Engine Maintenance** course to begin in April 5<sup>th</sup> in Towson.

We are in Desperate Need for <u>Instructors</u> for the ABC classes and others. Please contact me to volunteer. We can not succeed w/o You!!!



### SECRETARY'S REPORT

#### Secretary's Annual Report - March, 2010 to 2011

This final report covers the time period from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The Dundalk Sail and Power Squadron (DSPS) have lost only a few members during this period, while overall, throughout the country, membership has declined by approximately 5%. DSPS has been very active during this period, with several cruises, courses and community activities. Our treasury has declined a couple thousand dollars since this time last year. I don't see this as a big problem, but it is an issue that must be watched.

I have reviewed the attendance lists over the last year for the General Membership meetings. It fluctuates by a few; but, in general, it is the same members. We have between 29 and 44 members attending. Even for the Holiday meeting/party in December, our attendance is around 50 members. This is from a total membership of the Squadron of about 150. What this tells me is that most members are in the squadron for reasons other than knowing what is going on in the squadron.

I presented three questions to the membership in the March, 2011 publication of "On the Horizon". Those questions were: 1) Would you be interested in a position of greater responsibility in the Squadron, 2) Would you be more likely to attend the General Membership meetings if it were held on a different evening, 3) Would you be more to likely to attend the General Membership meetings if they were held in a different location. To date, I have received NO responses to my

three (3) questions, which tells me that either Squadron members are not reading the publication or they are ambivalent to participation/attendance in/to the Squadron/meetings. I have received a few verbal responses from members on the Executive Committee who always come to meetings.


