Why Were The Tides in June So High?

The first week in June saw extremely high tides, flooding piers and washing away of gear stowed above the usual high water lines.

The high tides were likely the result of the Sun, Earth and moon being in perfect alignment. There was a lunar eclipse (not visible here) which results from the Earth passing between the Sun and the moon, with the Earth casting its shadow on the moon.

The combined gravitational force of the moon (always the

dominant force in our ocean tides) with the much weaker gravitational force of the Sun AND the south wind all acted in unison. With its long fetch on the Chesapeake Bay, a south wind floods the upper bay and a north wind drains it.)

And, maybe even Venus, which was transiting the Sun, contributed a small gravitational tug.



MEDICAL EMERGENCIES AFLOAT

Management of medical emergencies will vary from fairly simple abrasions to highly complex catastrophes. You as captain or crew may not be able to handle all the situations that may befall you or a guest aboard your vessel. but, you can be prepared for the worst and know what to do, who to call and do it.

Be prepared!

- 1. Enroll in a first aid course through the Red Cross and renew every two years
- 2. Enroll in a CPR course and renew every two years
- 3. Be aware of any medical problems any guests aboard may have and that they have the proper medications on hand in the event of an emergency.
- 4. Note if anyone is wearing a Medic Alert bracelet or pendant to avoid rendering a service contrary to the victim's tolerance.
- 5. Have a well stocked First Aid Kit that includes saline solution, a generous supply of 4X4 and 2x2 gauze pads, bee sting anti-toxin, sunburn treatment medication, an eye washing cup, gloves, scissors, tweezers and wire cutters
- 6. Any medications should be dated and renewed annually.
- 7. In the event of a casualty, remain calm and above all else give comfort and reassurance to the victim.
- 8. Know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack, a stroke, diabetic shock /coma and heat prostration.
- 9. Be aware of your position on the water and on land.
- 10. Have the means to contact the Coast Guard or 911.
- 11. In the event that one can not contact the USCG, alternatives do exist:
